

Project Coordinator

The Project Coordinator will be the primary point of contact for all stakeholders involved with Holistic Rural Health is Regional Health, a regional project led by the Durham Region Migrant Worker Ministry. The successful candidate will lead the local and regional logistics of welcoming and preparing temporary foreign workers- specifically Caribbean and Spanish-speaking seasonal agricultural workers- for the 2021 agricultural season in Ontario.

WORKPLACE SETTINGS:

- Indoor faith-based facilities.
- Open-air festivals.
- Virtual settings including online video and audio conferencing rooms
- Open-field agricultural areas e.g. Farm fields, gravel grounds, dirt and/or mud grounds.
- Off-site work areas are predominantly populated by male service users and clergy.
- Evening and weekend work is necessary.

PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS:

- Light physical effort (e.g. some lifting and carrying of items up to 30 pounds, walking, standing.)
- Visual effort (e.g. concentrated research and reading).
- In-town and regional travel is a requirement via car or public transit to Clarington, Brock Township, Uxbridge, and Ajax on a scheduled weekly basis.

RESPONSIBILITIES:

Communications

- Organize and lead all in-person and video or audio conferencing meetings on a monthly basis with internal and external members of Durham Region Migrant Worker Ministry.
- Identify all local opportunities to provide ongoing updates of the project at least once monthly.
- Ensure timely updates of the 'migrantworkerdurham' website in English and Spanish.

- Manage databases of local, provincial, and federal health and social service agencies working with rural-suburban populations;
- Interpretation of conflicts or situations related to health and social services may require language translation. On-demand translation services will be made available.
- Communications in Spanish or Thai (speak, read, and write) is an asset.
- Develop and distribute a cumulative report for all stakeholders at the end of the project.

Community Relations

- Refer community members to health, social, and professional services in the immediate service area during health fairs and welcome events.
- Delegate tasks to network members as the on-site community events leader.
- Perform day-to-day duties of the contract position, including providing functional advice and guidance in unstructured workplace environments with some control over maintaining program standards.
- Considerable judgement and analysis may be required to determine network recommendations.
- Work with internal and external members to develop an inclusive, localized agricultural worker strategy
- Create and execute a project wrap-up and community appreciation event by end of June 2021.
